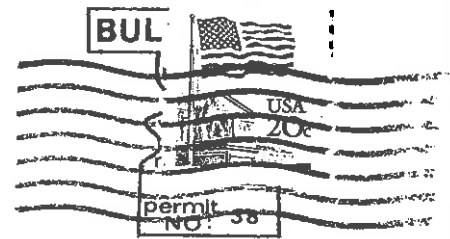

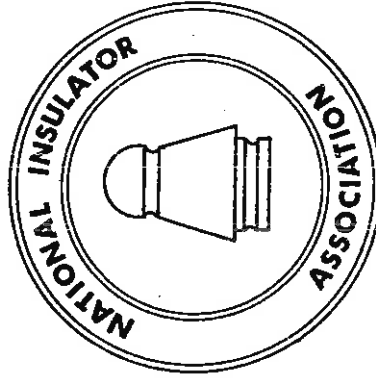

I AM ESPECIALLY PROUD OF MY NIA BOARD AND COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN, WHO HAVE ALL OUTDONE THEMSELVES. I THINK WE HAVE WORKED WELL TOGETHER AND I HOPE EACH OF THE THREE REGIONS FEEL THEY HAVE BEEN WELL REPRESENTED AND HAD AN EQUAL VOICE. A SINCERE THANK YOU TO ALL OF YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT!

LET'S TAKE A LOOK AT SOME OF THE THINGS THAT HAVE BEEN ACCOMPLISHED SINCE JULY, 1982. IT IS A GOOD FEELING TO SEE IT ALL IN ONE PLACE -

1. FAKE AND/OR ALTERED INSULATORS AND RELATED ITEMS, WHICH WERE PREVIOUSLY BANNED FROM THE PREMISES OF A NATIONAL OR REGIONAL SHOW, ARE NOW PERMITTED ON SALES TABLES AND AS PART OF AN EXHIBIT, IF THEY ARE CLEARLY LABELED AS SUCH.
2. WE ADDED A "NEW LOOK" TO THE COVER OF 'DRIP POINTS', AS WELL AS TO THE FORMAT INSIDE.
3. A REGIONAL OR NATIONAL SHOW HOST MAY NOW RECEIVE A REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE NIA FOR PAID ADVERTISING BY SUBMITTING RECEIPTS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS - UP TO 50% OF THE FIRST \$500.00 FOR A NATIONAL SHOW, AND UP TO 50% OF THE FIRST \$200.00 FOR A REGIONAL SHOW.

4. THE NIA HAS JOINED BOTH THE FEDERATION OF HISTORICAL BOTTLE CLUBS AND THE NATIONAL BOTTLE MUSEUM AS AN AFFILIATE MEMBER, THIS- FOR MUTUAL SUPPORT.

5. THROUGH THE TIRELESS EFFORTS AND GENEROSITY OF JOHN AND CAROL MC DOUGALD AND THE SALE OF THE 1983 NIA COMMEMORATIVE MICKEY MOUSE INSULATORS, OUR TREASURY BOASTS OF \$1,915.58 ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO BE USED FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES. (\$2.00 FROM EACH ONE WAS DONATED TO THE NIA)

6. A SPECIALLY APPOINTED COMMITTEE PROPOSED AND THE NIA BOARD APPROVED SOME VERY NECESSARY CHANGES TO OUR EXISTING SHOW RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS AND THE STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES USED TO JUDGE THESE EXHIBITS. JUDGES SCORE SHEETS WERE UPDATED ACCORDINGLY. THE CHANGES WILL ENCOURAGE QUALITY EXHIBITS AND INSURE A JUDGING SYSTEM THAT IS FAIR TO ALL.

7. DUE TO THE EFFORTS OF ANOTHER SPECIALLY APPOINTED COMMITTEE, THE NIA BOARD HAS VOTED TO ALLOW THE SALE OF COLLECTIBLES OTHER THAN INSULATORS AND RELATED ITEMS AT OUR NATIONAL SHOWS. A MAXIMUM EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO RE-SERVE 75% (OR NO LESS THAN 70) OF AVAILABLE SALES TABLES FOR INSULATORS, ETC., UP UNTIL A MONTH FROM THE SHOW DATE. THIS BECAME NECESSARY TO INSURE CONTINUED QUALITY SHOWS WITHOUT UNDUE FINANCIAL STRAIN ON THE SHOW HOST.

8. BECAUSE OF THE MANY CHANGES AND ADDITIONS TO OUR BY-LAWS AND SHOW RULES SINCE THE LAST REVISION OF THE NIA HANDBOOK IN NOVEMBER OF 1978, WE NOW HAVE NEWLY PRINTED HANDBOOKS

UPDATED TO JANUARY 1, 1984. A COPY OF THIS WENT OUT IN THE MAIL WITH EACH NEW MEMBERSHIP AND/OR RENEWAL THIS YEAR. INCLUDED ALSO, DUE TO INCREASED POPULAR DEMAND, WAS AN NIA WINDOW DECAL FOR EACH VOTING MEMBER.

9. IN FEBRUARY, 1984 OUR TOTAL NIA MEMBERSHIP REACHED AN ALL TIME HIGH OF 1212 MEMBERS! SO YOU SEE, WE'RE VERY MUCH ALIVE AND WELL!

PLEASE CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE NIA, AND YOUR NEW PRESIDENT WHEN HE TAKES OFFICE IN JULY, AS WELL AS HIS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN. THEIR MAIN OBJECTIVE IS TO ENRICH THE HOBBY FOR YOU.
