Columbia City Show Report

The May 5-6, 2023 Friday and Saturday show in Columbia City, Indiana was smaller than usual but still marked by some good purchases, sales, auction triumphs, walk-ins, food, and an informative show & tell session.

Dealers filled 21 sales tables. Show co-host Gene Hawkins in his yellow shirt had 2, co-host Mike McLaughlin had 3, Justin Stoudt had 3, Arlen & Tina Rienstra had 2, Josh Dondorf had 3, Ken Richardson had 1, Jim Johnson had 2, Dave Shaw had 2, Rick Soller had 1, Kim Borgman had 1, and Josephine Ramp had 1.

A few people walked into the show with insulators to sell. Some of these insulators ended up in the auction but a milky aqua CD 162 Hemingray No. 19 was shopped to dealers around the show and ended up going home with Rick Soller for \$400 – a bargain price for a piece listed in the price guide for \$500-600.

Those who attended the Friday evening show & tell session learned a great deal about K.C.G.W. insulators. Dump diggers present at the gathering included Arlen & Tina Rienstra, Bob Stahr, Rick Soller, and Gene Hawkins. Dump finds shown by Arlen included Fruit jar tops in shades of aqua, chunks of glass, and parts of a ketchup bottle (not made there but bottled there). Dump finds by Gene Hawkins included pieces of insulators with dots and bars, and small shards of a CD 120.

Testimony from the collectors at the event indicated that K.C.G.W. insulators were used all over the U.S. Specific reports indicated they were used in Western Kentucky, Indiana, and Alaska as well as other states.

Examples of the Fairmount company's insulators highlighted that the insulators generally came in limited colors. The most common colors ranged from aqua to dark green with the blue ones being one of the least common colors. A notable exception is a citrine piece in a Pennsylvania collection that was picked by a lineman. This piece was in a combined display at the Mid-Ohio show in Springfield a few years ago.

There were 36 lots offered by 8 sellers in the auction, grossing \$235 and netting \$23 in commissions for the show hosts. This averaged out to \$6.50 per lot with 10 lots selling for \$1 and the most expensive lot going for \$30. Out of 18 collectors signed up to bid in the auction, 14 (78%) were successful.

Wheaton Prairie Path Hunt

Around the time of the DuPage Collectors Expo show, is about when hunting on the prairie path is at its best. The weather is cool, and the vegetation hasn't made seeing insulators on the ground difficult. This year, Robert Schultz initiated the hunt with a group of four collectors heading out to explore a section of the trail that had not been searched yet as far as we know.

The timing of the hunt was tricky. Rain was predicted for several days after the April 1 show so Thursday, April 6, 2023 was picked as the best option. Robert Schultz, Rick Soller, new collector Larry Rotheiser, and Doug Pfau met at 9:30 a.m. near the intersection of Warrenville Road and Batavia Road to head north on the trail.

Nothing much was found over the course of the approximately 1-mile stretch that was searched. A few pieces of glass were found by Robert. Larry took home a modern gray porcelain lightning arrestor. Rick found a plastic Ohio Brass lightning arrestor but let someone else have it. Newer hardware consisting of a brass bolt-like clamp used to connect two wires and two aluminum gripping pieces was found. A heavy hunk of metal was also hauled out to be recycled.
